PATHWAYS FOR 3RD GRADE

- ▶ Beginning of Grade (B.O.G) Reading Test
 - ▶ Reading 3D :TRC – Level Q or higher
 - ▶ RTA Portfolio
 - ▶ End of Grade (E.O.G) Reading Test
 - ▶ RTA Test
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► Read to Achieve Act

Students who **do not** score a level 3, 4, or 5 on the End of Grade test will....

Be required to retest during the 2018-2019 school year.


Be required to attend a Reading “Summer Camp” and they will retest at the end of the Summer camp.

If they are not proficient after summer camp your child will be placed in fourth grade classes the following year but will be labeled as a third grade retention and will be eligible to retest in October to achieve a mid-year promotion and have the third-grade retention label removed.

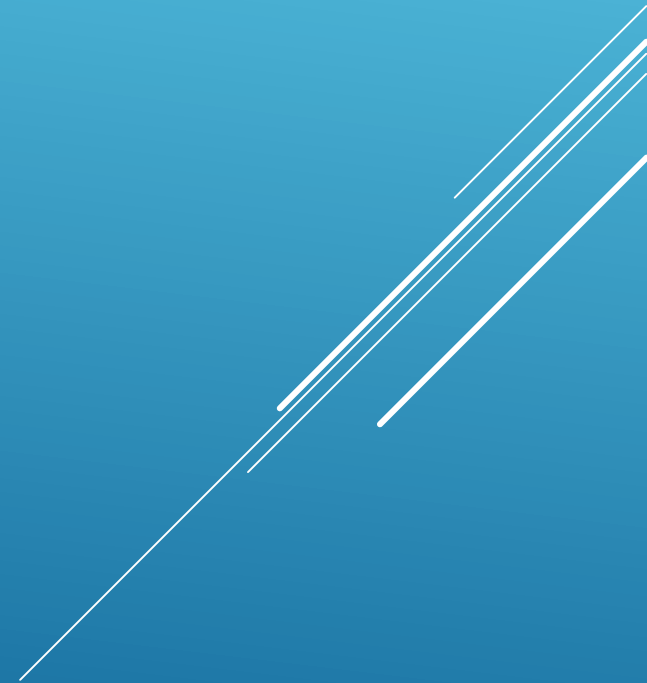
If you do not agree to send your child to the reading Summer camp they will repeat the third grade.

WHAT CAN I DO AS A PARENT TO HELP?

Parents can:

- ▶ • Read every night with your child; reinforce and review school work.
 - ▶ • Have conversations to build vocabulary and language and communication.
 - ▶ • Expose children to a variety of content areas.
 - ▶ Have open communication with teachers about the students. Communicate regularly to check your child's progress.
